


## POPULATION IN NORTH TYNESIDE 2010

This bulletin provides a summary of key demographic points for North Tyneside

## **KEY POINTS**

Baseline population...

■ North Tyneside's population rose by 1,300 (or 0.7%) in the year to mid-2010, to 198,500. This is a fall of -0.1% since 1981. Over the same period there was a fall of -3.2% in Tyne and Wear. Over the period 2001-2010 the population in North Tyneside grew by 3.4%, faster than growth of 3.0% in Tyne and Wear.



Ethnic minority representation...

- Experimental statistics for mid-2009 show that ethnic minority groups in North Tyneside made up 4.8% of the total population, compared with 6.7% for Tyne and Wear.
- The largest single ethnic minority group in North Tyneside is Indian, accounting for 0.8% of the total population. (The 'Other White<sup>1</sup>' group accounts for 2.1%.)

Natural change...

From mid-2009 to mid-2010 natural change was positive in North Tyneside, at 300. In Tyne and Wear the figure was 2,000 (based on ONS 2010 mid-year estimates).

## Internal (Domestic)


In 2010 North Tyneside had a net gain of +485 through net internal migration, compared with +635 in 2002. Net internal migration has been positive throughout the 2002-2010 period. In Tyne and Wear net internal migration has remained negative over the same period, but rose from -1,950 in 2002 to -2,227 in 2010.

## **International**

Net Total International Migration (TIM) was positive in North Tyneside in 2010, at 537.
This is an increase from 2002 (+299) but reflects a reversal of the losses experienced between 2006-2008.

■ In 2002-03 the number of new National Insurance numbers (NINos) issued to non-UK nationals resident in North Tyneside was 320. The two main groups represented were Filipino (12.5%) and Indian (9.4%). In 2009-10 there were 390 new numbers issued to non-UK nationals. In 2008-09 the main groups were Polish (19.6%) and Indian (8.7%).



Population projections...

■ The ONS projected population for North Tyneside to 2033 (based on their 2008 Mid-Year Estimates) is 231,300. This is a growth of 18.0% (or 35,300) from 2008 – the same percentage growth as for England. Tyne and Wear is projected to have a 10.3% (or 113,300) growth over the same period.
