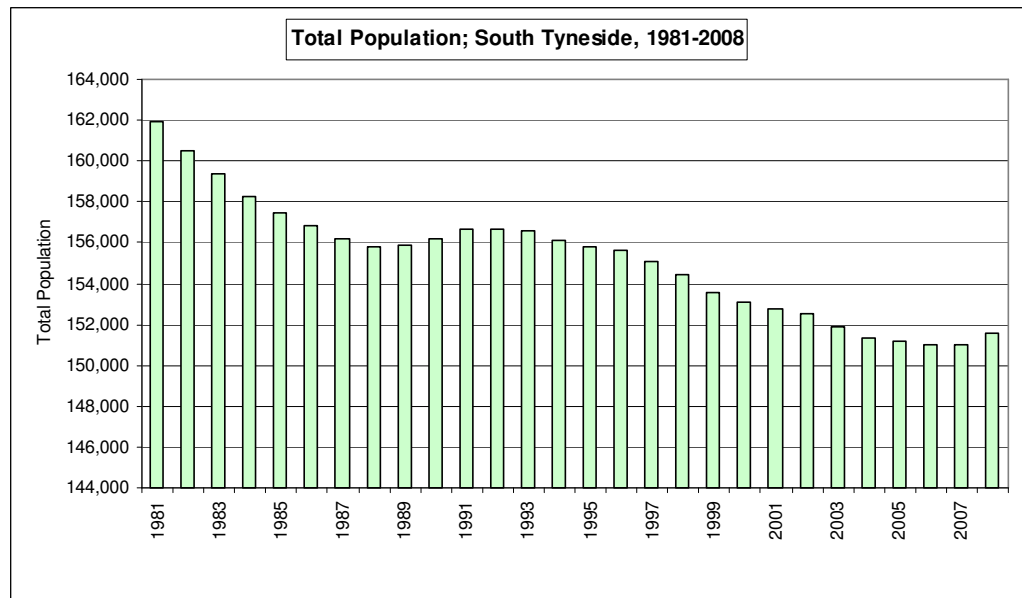


This bulletin provides a summary of key migration points for South Tyneside

KEY POINTS

Baseline population...

- South Tyneside's population rose by 600 (or 0.4%) in the year to mid-2008, to 151,600. This is a fall of -6.4% since 1981. Over the same period there was a fall of -5.4% in Tyne and Wear. Over the period 2001-2008 the population in South Tyneside fell by -0.8%, compared to growth of 0.6% in Tyne and Wear.



Ethnic minority representation...

- Experimental statistics for mid-2007 show that ethnic minority groups in South Tyneside made up 5.6% of the total population, compared with 5.8% for Tyne and Wear.
- The largest single ethnic minority group in South Tyneside is Indian, accounting for 2.1% of the total population. (The 'Other White'¹ group accounts for 0.9%.)

Natural change...

- From mid-2007 to mid-2008 natural change was negative in South Tyneside, at -50². In Tyne and Wear the figure was 1,300 (based on ONS 2008 mid-year estimates).

Migration...

Internal (Domestic)

- In 2008 net internal migration was zero in South Tyneside, following six years of population loss due to net internal migration from 2002. In Tyne and Wear net internal migration has remained negative over the same period, falling from -2,760 in 2002 to -2,190 in 2008.

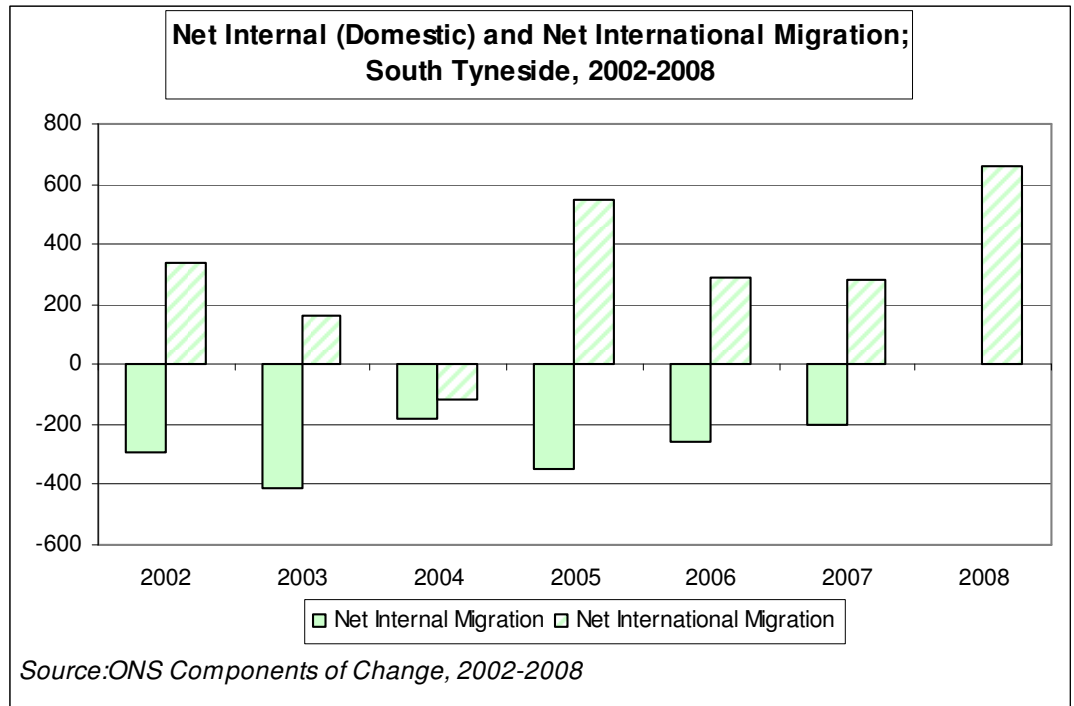
International

- Net Total International Migration was positive in South Tyneside in 2008, at 660. This reflects the strongest population gain from net TIM over the period 2002-2008.
- In 2002-03 the number of new National Insurance numbers (NINOs) issued to non-UK nationals resident in South Tyneside was 340. The two main groups represented were Indian (47.1%) and Bangladeshi (11.8%). In 2008-09 there were 670 new numbers

issued to non-UK nationals, and the main groups were Indian (59.7%) and Polish (4.5%).



Population projections...

- The projected population for South Tyneside to 2021 (based on ONS' 2006-based figures) is 152,800. This is an increase of 1.2% from 2006. Tyne and Wear is projected to have a 3.4% increase over the same period.
