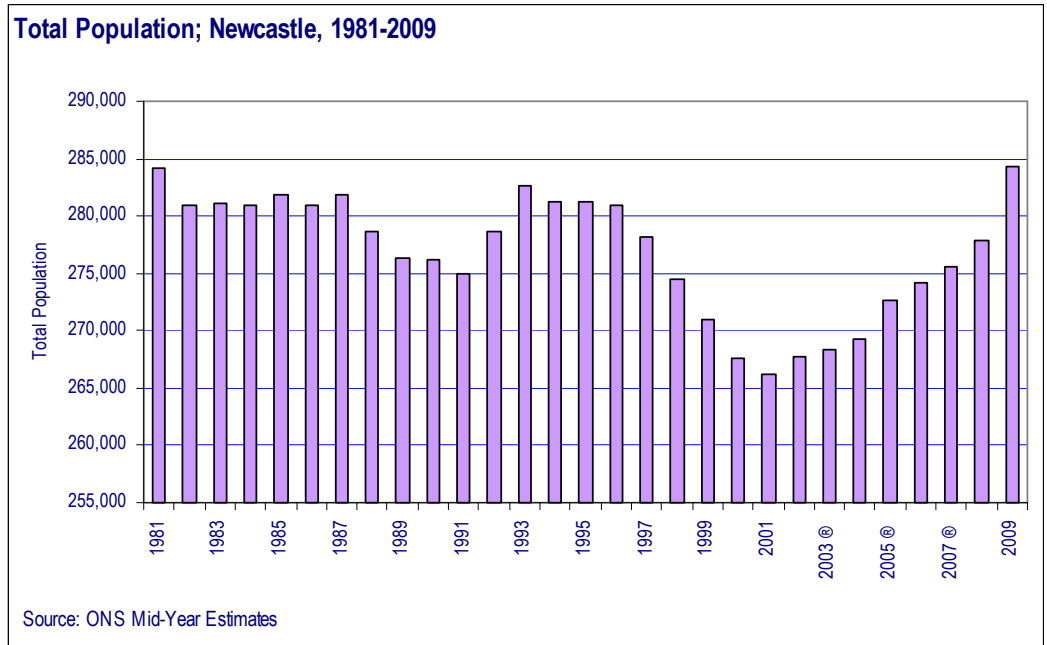


This bulletin provides a summary of key demographic points for Newcastle upon Tyne

KEY POINTS

Baseline population...

- **Newcastle's population rose by 6,500 (or 2.3%) in the year to mid-2009**, to 284,300. This brings its population back to its 1981 level. Over the same period there was a fall of -4.3% in Tyne and Wear. Over the period 2001-2009 the population in Newcastle grew by 6.8%, faster than growth of 1.8% in Tyne and Wear.



Ethnic minority representation...

- Experimental statistics for mid-2007¹ show that ethnic minority groups in Newcastle made up 10.7% of the total population, compared with 5.8% for Tyne and Wear.
- The largest single ethnic minority groups in Newcastle are Pakistani and Indian, each accounting for 1.9% of the total population. (The 'Other White'² group accounts for 2.9%.)

Natural change...

- From mid-2008 to mid-2009 natural change was positive in Newcastle, at 700. In Tyne and Wear the figure was 1,500 (based on ONS 2009 mid-year estimates).

Migration...

Internal (Domestic)

- Over the period 2002-2009 Newcastle has continued to lose population due to net internal migration, except in 2004. Net loss has increased from -601 in 2002 to -1,648 in 2009. Net outflow was higher in 2008, at -2,202. In Tyne and Wear net internal migration has remained negative over the same period, but rose from -1,950 in 2002 to -2,364 in 2009.

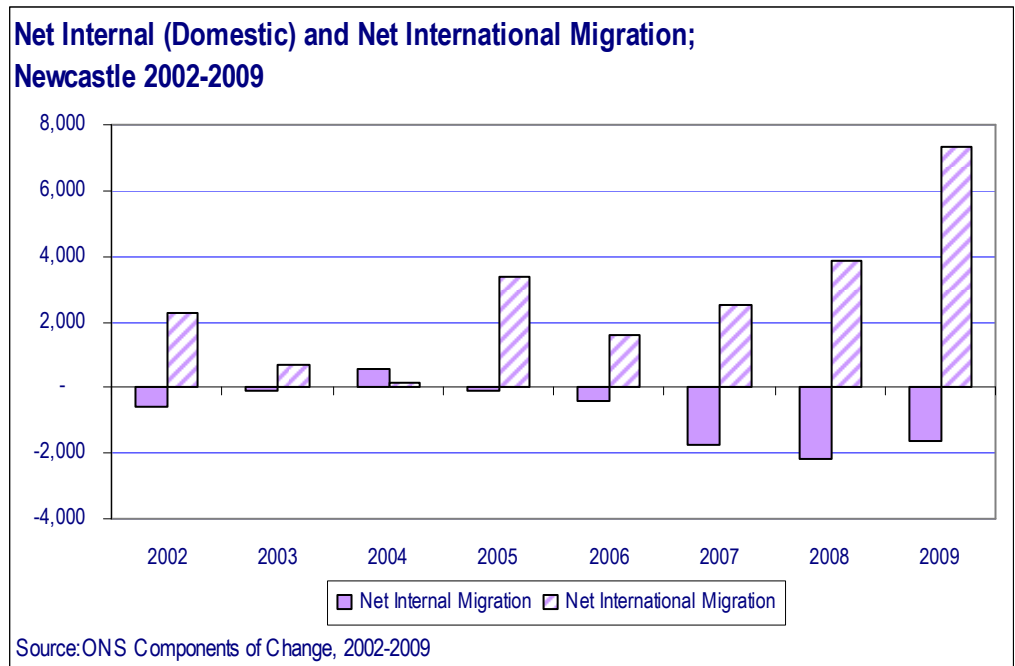
International

- Net Total International Migration (TIM) was strongly positive in Newcastle in 2009, at 7,330. Net TIM has remained positive in Newcastle throughout the period 2002-2009.

² This refers to those who are neither White British, nor White Irish, but White.

- In 2002-03 the number of new National Insurance numbers (NINos) issued to non-UK nationals resident in Newcastle was 1,770. The two main groups represented were Chinese (14.7%) and Indian (7.9%). In 2008-09 there were 4,470 new numbers issued to non-UK nationals, and the main groups were Indian (19.0%) and Chinese (10.5%).



Population projections...

- The ONS projected population for Newcastle to 2033 (based on their 2008 Mid-Year Estimates) is 318,200. This is a growth of 14.5% (or 40,400) from 2008. Tyne and Wear is projected to have a 10.3% (or 113,300) growth over the same period.
