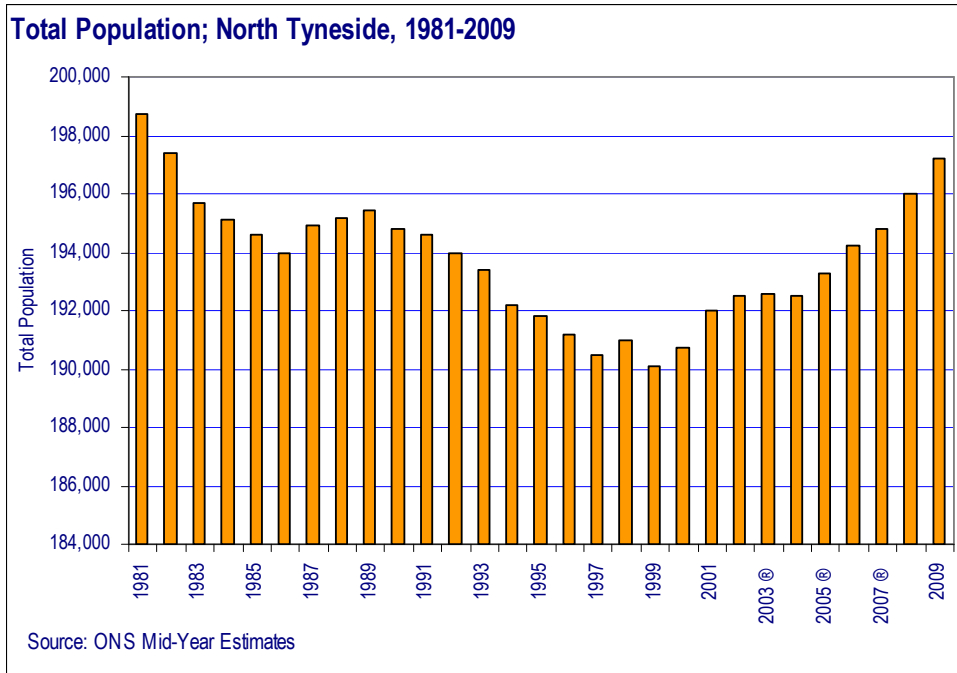
POPULATION IN NORTH TYNESIDE 2009

This bulletin provides a summary of key demographic points for North Tyneside

KEY POINTS

Baseline population...

- North Tyneside's population rose by 1,200 (or 0.6%) in the year to mid-2009, to 197,200. This is a fall of -0.8% since 1981. Over the same period there was a fall of -4.3% in Tyne and Wear. Over the period 2001-2009 the population in North Tyneside grew by 2.7%, faster than growth of 1.8% in Tyne and Wear.



Ethnic minority representation...

- Experimental statistics for mid-2007¹ show that ethnic minority groups in North Tyneside made up 3.9% of the total population, compared with 5.8% for Tyne and Wear.
- The largest single ethnic minority group in North Tyneside is Indian, accounting for 0.6% of the total population. (The 'Other White'² group accounts for 1.6%.)

Natural change...

- From mid-2007 to mid-2009 natural change was positive in North Tyneside, at 200. In Tyne and Wear the figure was 1,500 (based on ONS 2009 mid-year estimates).

Migration...

Internal (Domestic)

- In 2009 North Tyneside had a net gain of +499 through net internal migration, compared with +635 in 2002. Net internal migration has been positive throughout the 2002-2009 period. In Tyne and Wear net internal migration has remained negative over the same period, but rose from -1,950 in 2002 to -2,364 in 2009.

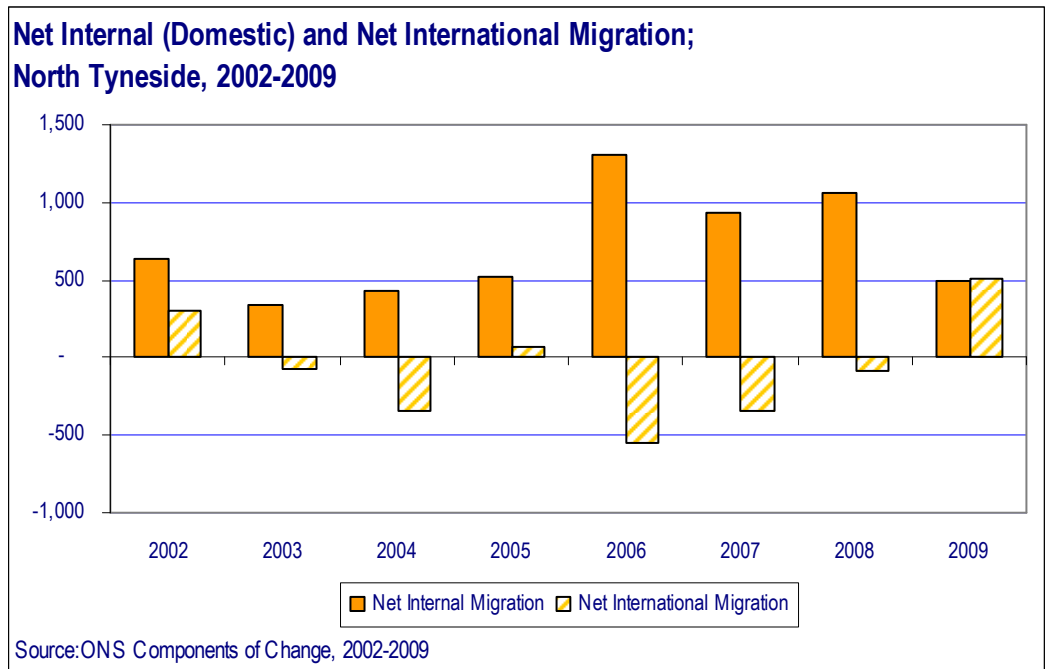
International

- Net Total International Migration (TIM) was positive in North Tyneside in 2009, at 502. This is an increase from 2002 (+299) but reflects a reversal of the losses experienced between 2006-2008.

² This refers to those who are neither White British, nor White Irish, but White.

- In 2002-03 the number of new National Insurance numbers (NINos) issued to non-UK nationals resident in North Tyneside was 320. The two main groups represented were Filipino (12.5%) and Indian (9.4%). In 2008-09 there were 460 new numbers issued to non-UK nationals, and the main groups were Polish (19.6%) and Indian (8.7%).



Population projections...

- The ONS projected population for North Tyneside to 2033 (based on their 2008 Mid-Year Estimates) is 231,300. This is a growth of 18.0% (or 35,300) from 2008 – the same percentage growth as for England. Tyne and Wear is projected to have a 10.3% (or 113,300) growth over the same period.
