

NEW DEAL TABLES May 2007

(Published November 2007, not released by DWP until February 2008)

Four tables are presented.

Tables 1 and 2 cover participants in the New Deal for Young People (NDYP).

Tables 3 and 4 cover the Long-Term Unemployed aged 25+ (ND25+) in Great Britain. NDYP is aimed at those aged 18-24 who have been claiming Jobseekers Allowance (JSA) for at least 6 months.

Until April 2001, the ND25+ was aimed at those claiming Jobseekers Allowance (JSA) for at least 2 years. From April 2001, an enhanced programme for those claiming JSA for 18 months or more was introduced.

Note: The 'unemployment claimant count' includes the people who are in the New Deal "Gateway". Once people are on an option they are not counted as claimant unemployed.

Note: The structure of Jobcentre Plus districts changed in April 2005, resulting in 69 districts instead of the previous 85. The effect for the North East Jobcentre Plus region was that Newcastle & North Tyneside merged directly with Northumberland to create the new Northumbria district.

Reference dates for the release of data have also been changed. Leavers, destinations, jobs and point-in-time participant statistics are published 5 months after the reference period while starts statistics are published 2 months after the reference period.

The next data release scheduled by DWP (for both August and November data) is in May 2008.
