



A Profile of Victims of Crime Sunderland, 2008/09

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KEY MESSAGES

In 2008/09 there were 16,031 (people) victims of crimes committed in Sunderland. 90% of these victims also lived within Sunderland.

Of victims where the crime was committed in Sunderland in 2008/09:

- Over one quarter (26%) were subjected to crimes of a violent¹ nature.
- 28% were aged 18-29 years old.
- 54% were male, this compares to 49% of the total residential population of Sunderland.
- 6% were from a Black and Minority Ethnic (BME) group, compared to 3.9% of the total population.
- 51% were in employment.

Of the 14,978 victims who had a home address within Sunderland in 2008/09:

- One quarter (25%) were subjected to crimes of a violent nature.
- 28% were aged 18-29 years old, whilst 53% were male.
- 6% were from a Black and Minority Ethnic (BME) group.

During 2008/09 4,151 violent crimes were committed in Sunderland:

- 80% were committed by a stranger.
- 91% of male victims compared to 68% of female victims were attacked by strangers.
- 29% of female violent crime victims were subjected to domestic violence.

During 2008/09 in Sunderland there were on average:

- 346 victims of violent crime per month. July to September quarter saw the most victims of this type.
- 593 victims of violent crime per day of the week. Saturdays and Sundays saw the highest numbers.
- The number of victims of violent crime increased from early morning (6-7am) to a peak between 12am and 1am. The number of victims between 9pm and 1am accounted for one third of all violent crime victims.
- Victims aged between 10 and 17 accounted for approximately 35% of all violent crime victims during 12-1pm and 3-4pm, coinciding with school lunch breaks and school children going home from school.
- Those victims of Violent Crime aged 18-24 years were more likely to be a victim between 9pm-4am, than any other age group.

During 2008/09:

- There were 19,481 items of stolen property recorded by Northumbria Police. The total value of property stolen (including that recovered) was £7,323,220.
- 3,063 (16%) stolen items were recovered. The total value of property recovered was £1,880,481.

In 2008/09 there were 7,027 business victims of crimes committed in Sunderland. Almost one third (33%) of these crimes were against Northumbria Police. 37% of all business victims were of Theft Other. This category includes 'Theft from Shops and Stalls', which accounted for almost three quarters (717) of these business victims. During the same year, there were 4,377 business victims of crime in Sunderland, where the business 'home' address was given as being in Sunderland.

This report aims to give an overview of the demographic profile of victims, identifying particular groups of people who have experienced disproportionate levels of crime. Where the crime was committed and the home address of the victim is analysed. The type of property stolen is profiled, along with a brief profile on businesses that have been victims of crime. Temporal analysis has also been undertaken, as crime trends can be influenced by a range of factors that fluctuate according to time of the week or time of the year.

Data are provided for one year only, 2008/09, therefore care should be taken when drawing conclusions.

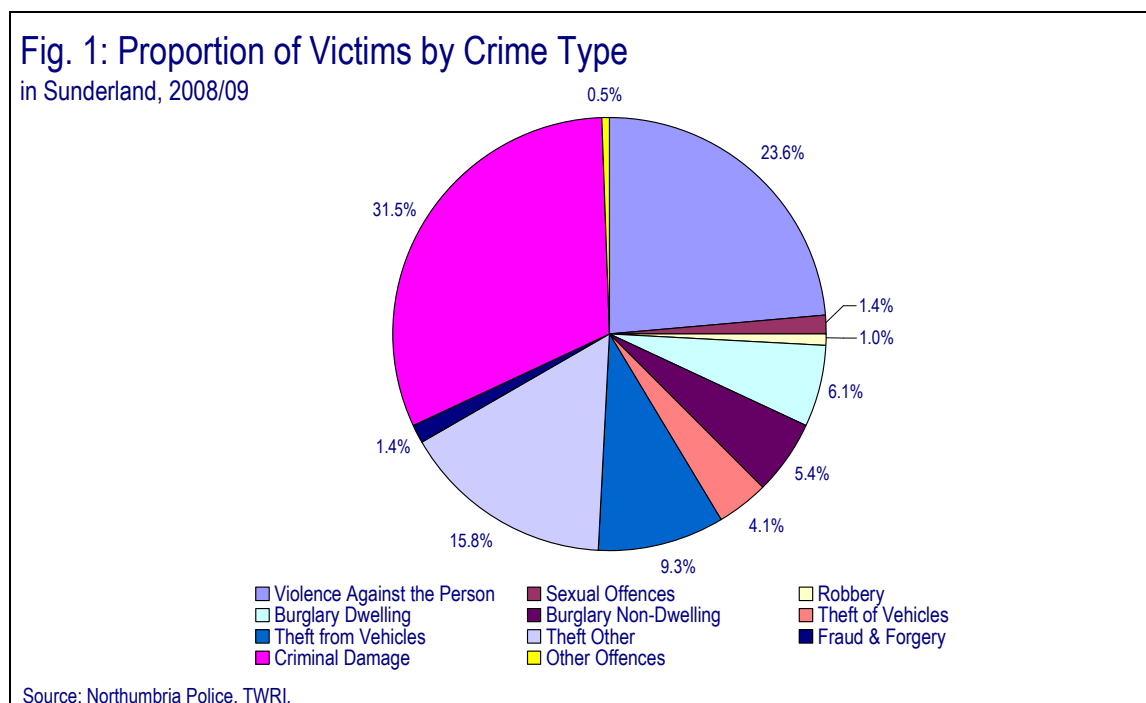
1. Demographic Profile of Victims of Crime – Where the Crime was Committed in Sunderland

Data within section 1 refers to the characteristics of victims where the crime against them occurred within Sunderland, independently of their home address.

1.1 Distribution of Different Types of Crime

In 2008/09 there were 16,031 victims of crime in Sunderland.

Over one quarter (26%) of these victims were subjected to crimes of a violent² nature, whilst almost one third (31.5%) were victims of Criminal Damage (Fig. 1).



² Violent crime comprises Violence Against the Person (VAP), Sexual offences and Robbery. VAP covers the whole spectrum of assaults from pushing and shoving, with no physical harm, to murder.

1.2 Age of Victims

In Sunderland during 2008/09:

- One quarter of victims of Violence Against the Person were aged 18-24 despite this age group representing only 10% of the residential population of Sunderland.
- 2% of victims of Violence Against the Person were aged 60+ even though this age group accounted for over one fifth (22%) of the residential population of Sunderland.
- Half of victims of Sexual Offences were aged 17 or under. This age group accounts for 21% of the residential population of Sunderland.
- 46% of victims of Robbery were aged 10-24. This age group accounted for only one fifth of the residential population of Sunderland.
- 43% of victims of Burglary Dwelling and 48% of victims of Burglary Non-dwelling were aged 30-49. This age group accounted for 28% of the residential population of Sunderland.

In Sunderland during 2008/09:

- Almost half (46%) of victims of Theft of Vehicles and 45% of victims of Theft from Vehicles were aged between 30 and 49 years old. However, only 28% of the residential population were in this age group.
- The age of victims of Theft Other (which includes Theft from the Person and Theft of Pedal Cycle) was well distributed across the whole age spectrum, with the exception of those under 18 years old, where it was lower.
- Those aged 30 or over were more likely to be a victim of Fraud & Forgery, than those aged under 30 (16% of all victims).
- 46% of victims of Criminal Damage were aged 30-49. This age group accounted for only 28% of the residential population of Sunderland.

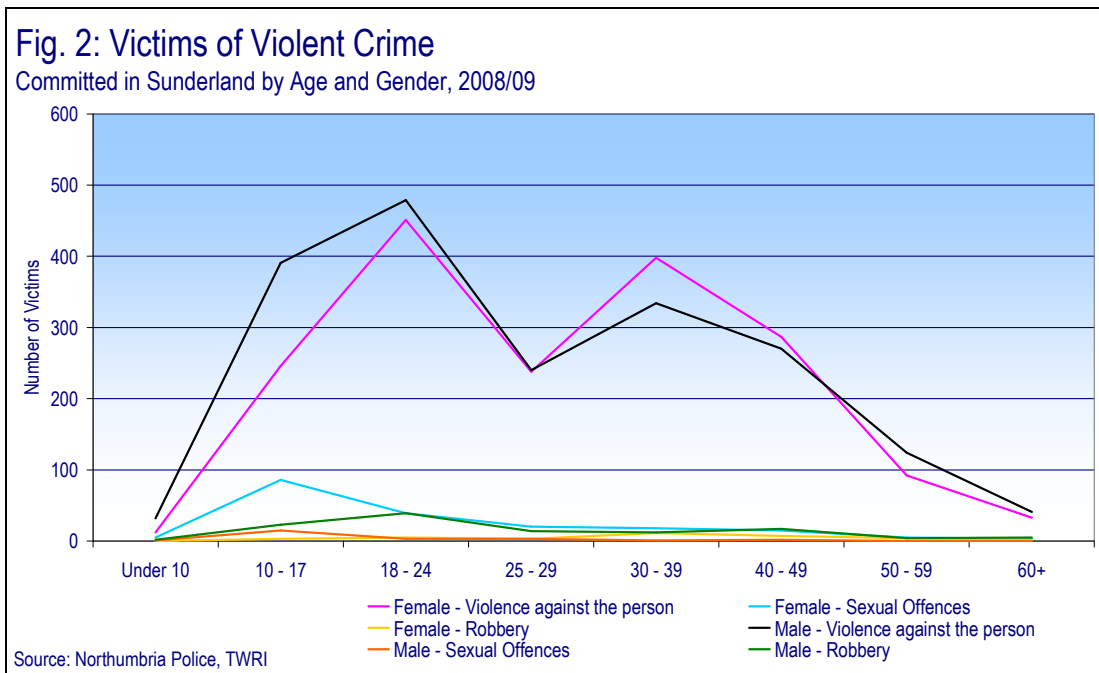

1.3 Age and Gender of Victims

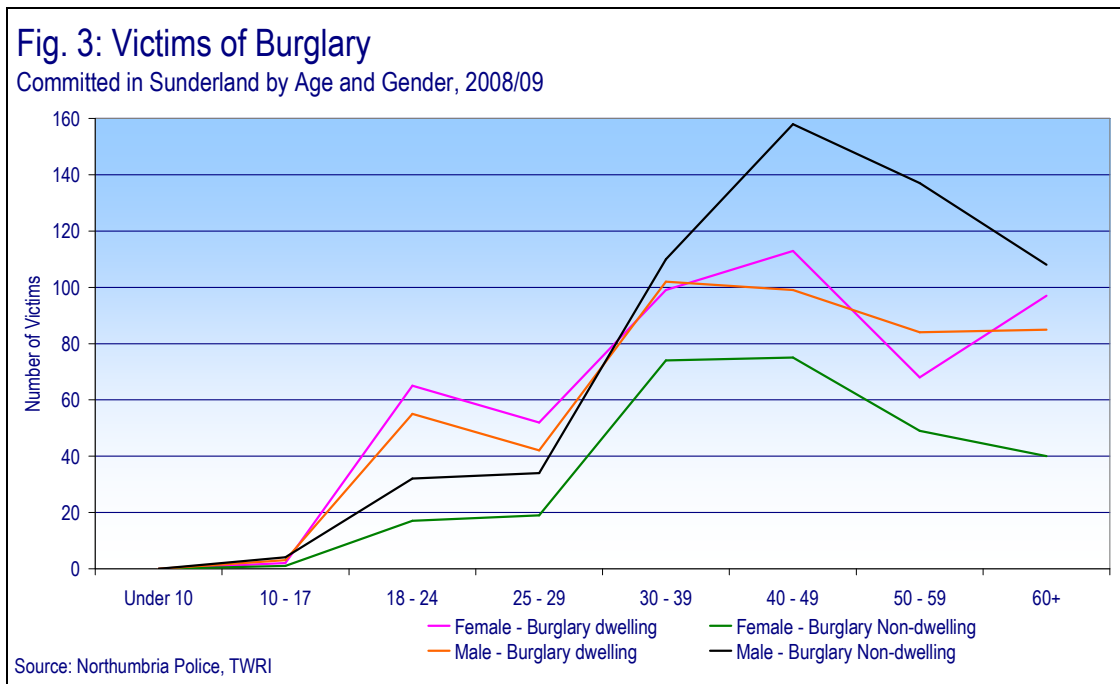
In Sunderland during 2008/09:

- 54% of victims of crime were male, this compares to 49% of the total residential population of Sunderland.
- 44% of male victims of Violence Against the Person were aged 10–24 year olds. Males in the 10-24 age group accounted for 21% of the male residential population of Sunderland.
- 88% of victims of Sexual Offences were female, 45% of these female victims were aged 10-17. Those aged 10-17 accounted for just 10% of the female residential population of Sunderland.
- 11% of victims of Sexual Offences were male. 60% of male victims were aged 10-17. 10-17 year old males accounted for only 11% of the male residential population of Sunderland.
- Almost a quarter (23%) of victims of Robbery were female. Almost a third of these victims (31%) were aged 30-39. Females aged 30-39 accounted for 13% of the female residential population of Sunderland.
- Only 6% of female victims of Robbery were aged 60 and over despite accounting for almost a quarter (24%) of the residential population of Sunderland.
- Over three quarters (76%) of Robbery victims were male. Over half (53%) of male Robbery victims were aged 10-24.



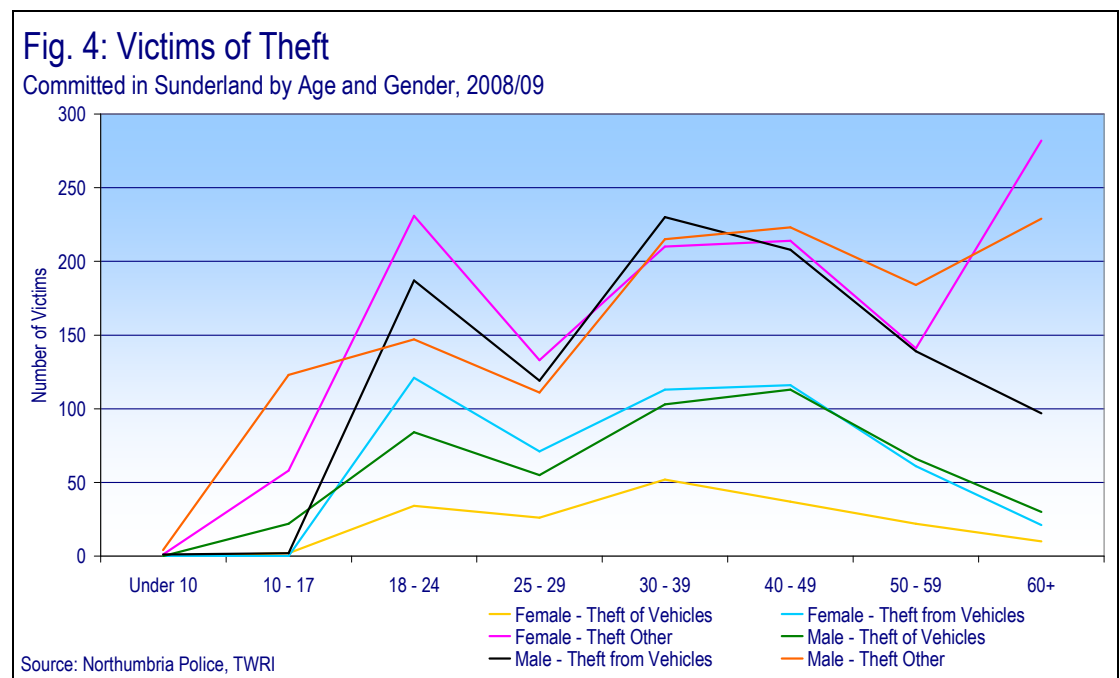
In Sunderland during 2008/09:

- Almost a third (32%) of victims of Burglary Non-dwelling were female. Over half (54%) of these female victims were aged 30-49.



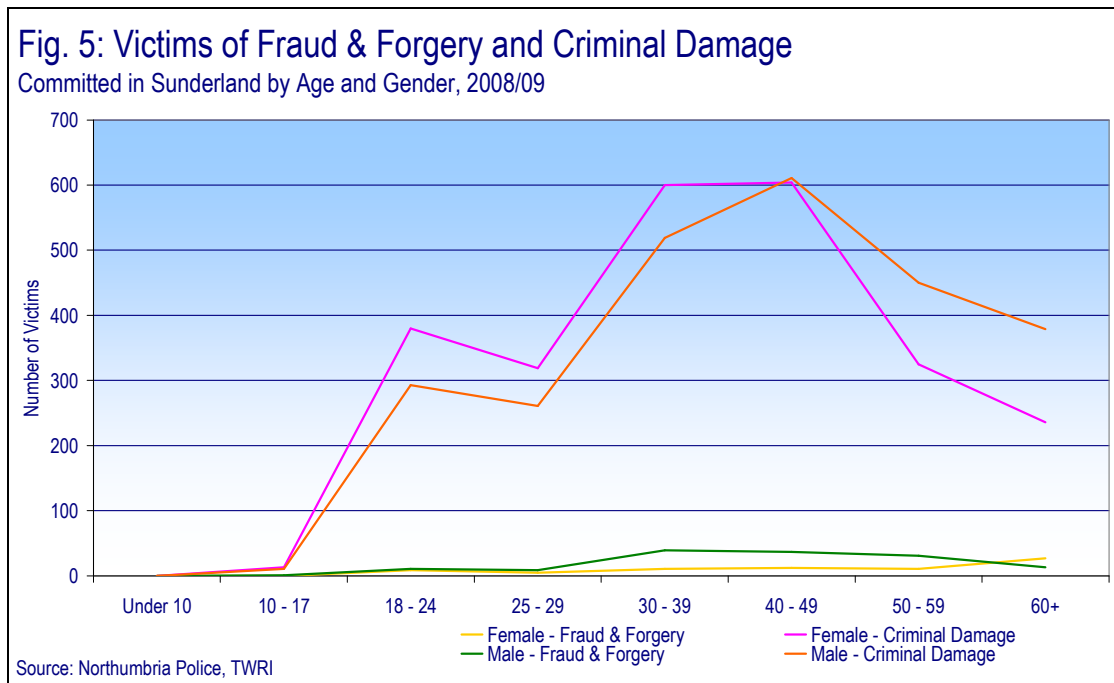
In Sunderland during 2008/09:

- Over a quarter (28%) of Theft of Vehicles were from female victims. Almost half (48%) of these female victims were aged 30-49.
- Slightly over a third (34%) of victims of Theft from Vehicles were female. Almost a quarter (24%) of these female victims were aged 18-24 even though females of this age group accounted for only 9% of the residential population of Sunderland.
- 72% of Theft of Vehicles and two thirds of Theft from Vehicle victims of crime were male. 45% of male victims of Theft of Vehicles and 44% of Theft from Vehicle were aged 30-49. This age group accounted for 28% of the male residential population of Sunderland.



In Sunderland during 2008/09:

- Over a third (35%) of victims of Fraud & Forgery were female. 36% of these victims were aged 60+ years old despite representing only 24% of the female residential population of Sunderland.
- Three quarters of male victims of Fraud & Forgery were aged 30-59. This age group accounted for 41% of the male residential population of Sunderland.



1.4 Ethnicity of Victims

In Sunderland during 2008/09:

- 6% of victims of Violence Against the Person and 7% of Burglary Non-dwelling victims were from a BME group.
- 18% of Robbery victims were from a BME group, even though those of BME origin represented only 3.9% of the population of Sunderland.

In Sunderland during 2008/09:

- Between 5 and 6% of victims of Theft of Vehicle, Theft from Vehicle, Theft Other and Criminal Damage victims were from a BME group.
- 9% of Fraud & Forgery victims were of Asian or Asian British ethnic origin despite accounting for only 1.8% of the population of Sunderland.

1.5 Occupation of Victims

In Sunderland during 2008/09:

- Almost one third (32%) of Violence Against the Person victims were unemployed. Over one third (36%) of victims of Violence Against the Person were employed. The occupations with the most number of victims were: Police officer (138), Shop/sales assistant (93) and Manager (61).
- Over half (52%) of victims of Sexual Offences were either school children or students. Over a fifth (22%) of victims of Sexual Offences were unemployed.
- 18% of Robbery victims were students, whilst 12% were school children.
- Over half (52%) of Burglary Dwelling victims and 70% of Burglary Non-dwelling victims were in employment. Occupations with the highest number of Burglary Dwelling victims were Managers (25), Landlords (19) and self-employed (16).

In Sunderland during 2008/09:

- 5% of Theft of Vehicles victims were retired.
- Three quarters of victims of Theft from Vehicles were in employment. Occupations with the highest number of victims were: managers (61), taxi drivers (39) and engineers (36).
- More than two thirds (69%) of victims of Fraud & Forgery were in employment. Occupations with the highest number of victims were taxi drivers (89).

2. Demographic Profile of Victims of Crime – Where the Victims Live in Sunderland

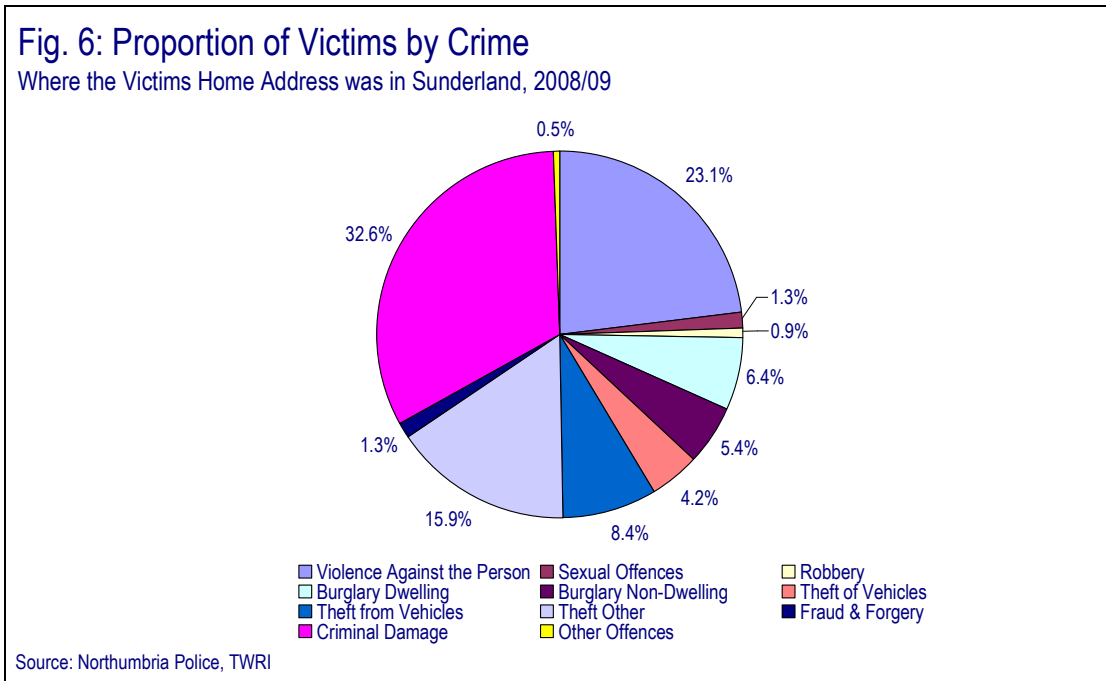
Data within section 2 refers to the characteristics of victims where the home address was given as being in Sunderland. The crime will have been committed within Tyne & Wear, although not necessarily within Sunderland.

2.1 Distribution of Different Types of Crime

In 2008/09 14,978 victims of crimes had a home address in Sunderland. The crime will have been committed within Tyne & Wear, although not necessarily within Sunderland.

One quarter (25%) of these victims were subjected to crimes of a violent³ nature, whilst one third were victims of Criminal Damage (Fig. 6).

³ Violent crime comprises Violence Against the Person (VAP), Sexual offences and Robbery. VAP covers the whole spectrum of assaults from pushing and shoving, with no physical harm, to murder.



2.2 Age of Victims

Victims who had a home address in Sunderland during 2008/09:

- 28% of victims of crime were aged 18-29 years, even though this age group accounted for only 17% of the residential population of Sunderland.
- 11% of victims of crime were aged over 60 years old, compared to 22% of the residential population.
- 25% of victims of Violence Against the Person crime were aged 18-24, this age group accounted for only 10% of the residential population of Sunderland.
- Almost half (48%) of victims of Sexual Offences were aged 10-17. This age group accounted for only 10% of the residential population of Sunderland.
- 43% of victims of Burglary Dwelling and almost half (48%) of Burglary Non-dwelling victims were aged 30-49. This age group accounted for 28% of the residential population of Sunderland.

Victims who had a home address in Sunderland during 2008/09:

- Almost half (46%) of victims of Theft of Vehicles and 45% of Theft from Vehicles victims were aged between 30 and 49 years old. However, only 28% of the residential population were in this age group.
- The age of victims of Theft Other (which includes Theft from the Person and Theft of Pedal Cycle) was well distributed across the whole age spectrum, with the exception of those under 18 years old, where it was lower.
- Those aged 30 or over were more likely to be a victim of Fraud & Forgery, than those aged under 30 (15% of all victims).
- The age of victims of Criminal Damage was well distributed across the whole age spectrum, with the exception of those aged under 18 years old, where it was lower.

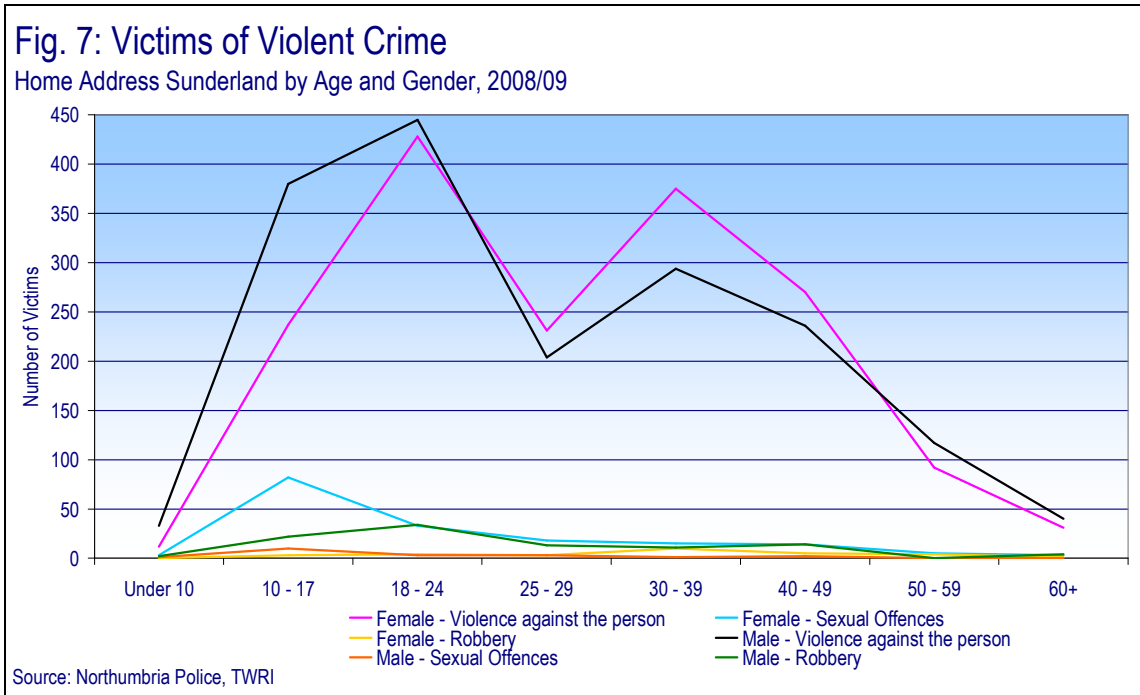

2.3 Age and Gender of Victims

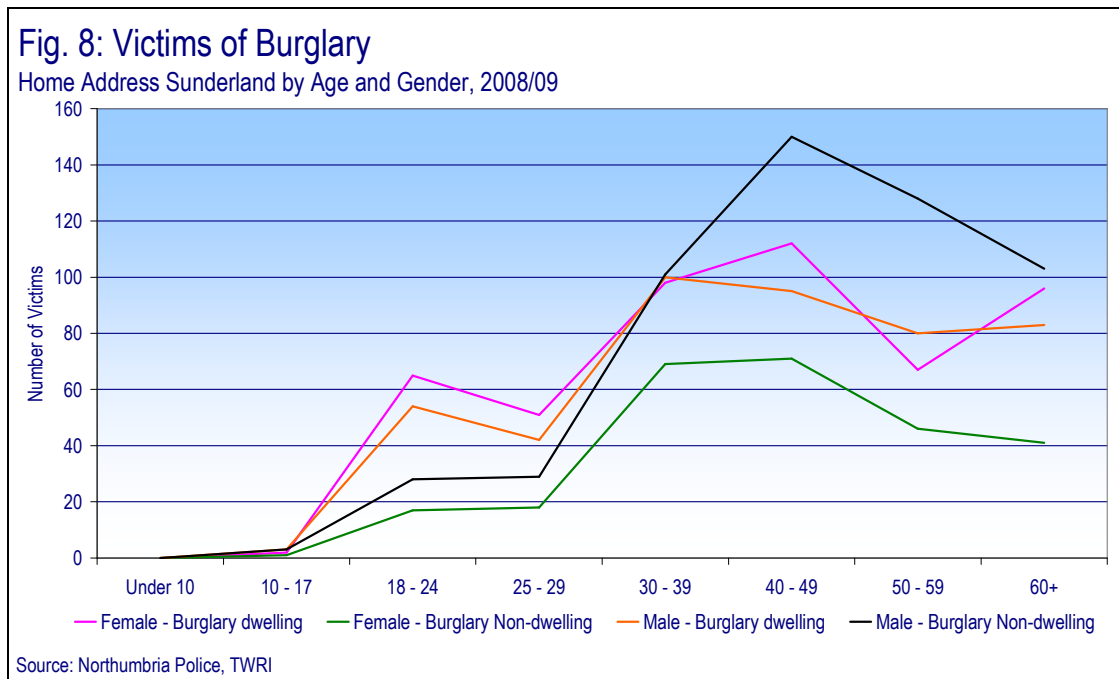
Victims who had a home address in Sunderland during 2008/09:

- 53% of victims of crime were male, this compares to 49% of the total residential population of Sunderland.
- One quarter of male victims of Violence Against the Person were 18-24 year old, despite accounting for only 10% of males living in Sunderland.
- 89% of victims of Sexual Offences were female. 47% of these female victims were aged 10-17. This age group accounted for 10% of the female residential population of Sunderland.
- 10% of victims of Sexual Offences were male. Half of these males were aged 10-17.
- Over three quarters (76%) of Robbery victims were male. Over a third (34%) of these males were aged 18-24.
- Almost a quarter (23%) of Robbery victims were female. One third of female victims of robbery were aged 30-39. This age group accounted for only 13% of the female residential population of Sunderland.



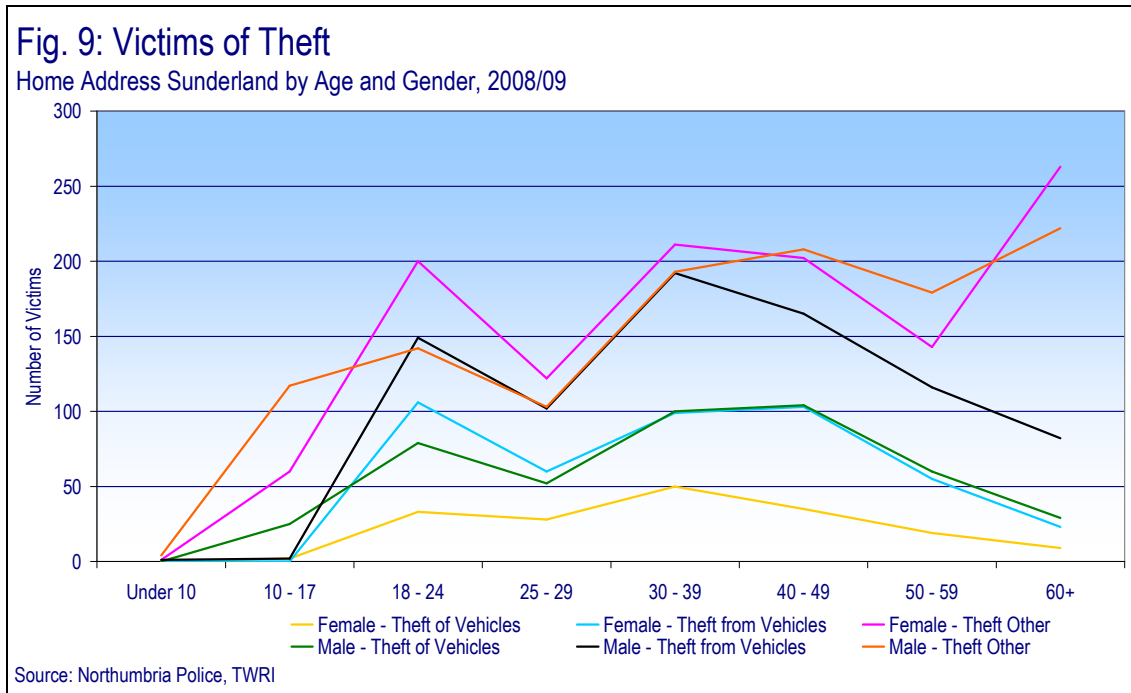
Victims who had a home address in Sunderland during 2008/09:

- Over two thirds (67%) of Burglary Non-dwelling victims were males. Over half (51%) of these males were aged 40-59.
- One third of victims of Burglary Non-dwelling were female. Over half (53%) of these victims were aged 30-49.



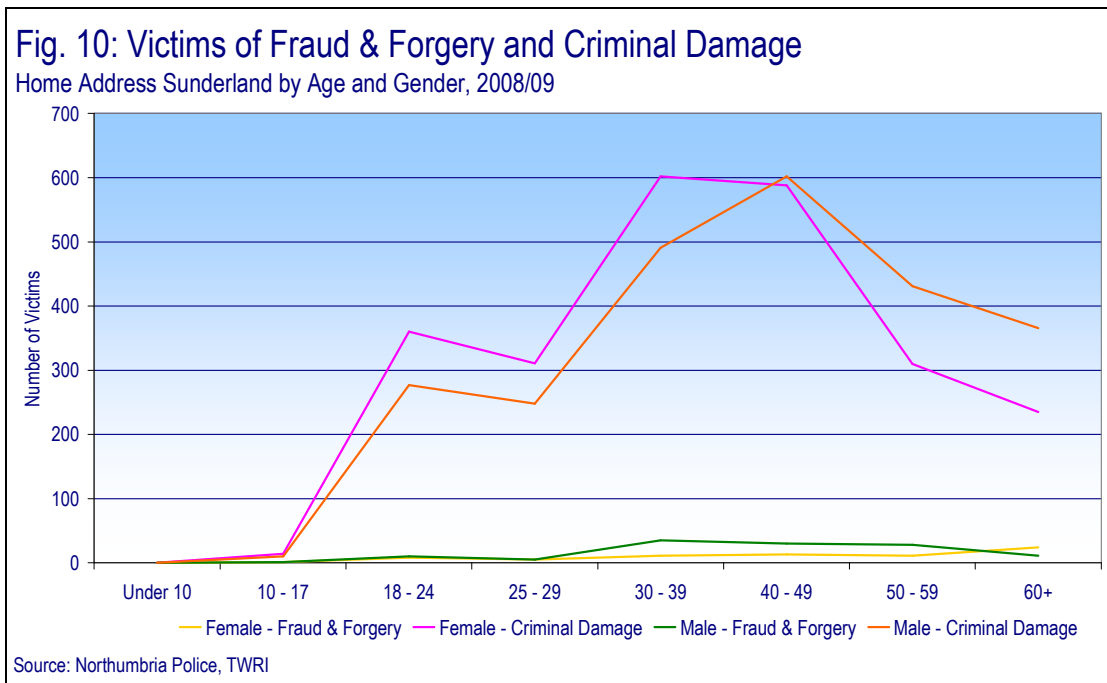
Victims who had a home address in Sunderland during 2008/09:

- 28% of victims of Theft of Vehicles were female. Over a quarter (28%) of these females were aged 30-39 despite representing only 13% of the female residential population of Sunderland.
- 72% of Theft of Vehicles victims were male. 45% of these male victims were aged 30-49. This age group accounted for 28% of the male residential population of Sunderland.
- Over a third (36%) of Theft from Vehicles were female. Almost a quarter (24%) of female victims were aged 18-24.
- Almost two thirds (64%) of victims of Thefts from Vehicles were male. Of these males 44% were aged 30-49.



Victims who had a home address in Sunderland during 2008/09:

- Over a third (37%) of victims of Fraud & Forgery were female. A third of female victims were aged over 60. Females in the 60+ age group accounted for 24% of the residential population of Sunderland.
- Almost two thirds (62%) of victims of Fraud & Forgery were male. 77% of these males were aged 30-59. This age group accounted for 41% of the male residential population of Sunderland.



2.4 Ethnicity of Victims

Victims who had a home address in Sunderland during 2008/09:

- 6% of victims of crime were from a Black and Minority Ethnic (BME) group, this is a higher proportion than that of the overall population, where 3.9% were from a BME group.
- 6% of victims of Violence Against the Person were from a BME group even though this group accounted for only 3.9% of the population of Sunderland.
- 11% of victims of Robbery were of Asian or Asian British ethnic origin, this compares to just 1.8% of the total population of Sunderland
- 7% of victims of Burglary Non-dwellings were from a BME group.

Victims who had a home address in Sunderland during 2008/09:

- Between 5 and 7% of victims of Vehicle-related Crime, Theft Other and Criminal Damage were from a BME group despite the fact that people from a BME group accounted for only 3.9% of the population of Sunderland.
- 7% of victims of Fraud & Forgery living in Sunderland were of Asian or Asian British ethnic origin despite accounting for only 1.8% of the population of Sunderland.

2.5 Occupation of Victims

Victims who had a home address in Sunderland during 2008/09:

- One third of victims of Violence Against the Person were in employment. The occupations with the highest number of victims were: Sales/Shop Assistant (83), Manager (55), and factory worker (28).
- 40% of victims of Sexual Offences were school children.
- 41% of victims of Robberies were employed.
- Over half (51%) of Burglary Dwelling victims were employed. Occupations with the highest number of victims were: Manager (24), self employed (15) and teacher (14).
- More than two thirds (69%) of victims of Burglary Non-dwelling were employed.

Victims who had a home address in Sunderland during 2008/09:

- 64% of Theft of Vehicles victims were in employment.
- 76% of Theft from Vehicle victims were in employment. Occupations with the highest number of victims were managers (46), taxi drivers (38) and engineers (28).
- 18% of Theft Other victims were retired, whilst 12% were either school children or students.
- Just over half (52%) of Criminal Damage victims were in employment, whilst just over one quarter (28%) were classed as being unemployed.

3. Violent Crime in Sunderland and the Relationship between Victim and Perpetrator

During 2008/09 4,151 violent crimes were committed in Sunderland. Of these crimes the majority (79.9%) were committed by a stranger. 16.5% of violent crime was classed as domestic violence, where the offence was committed by a known family member or partner⁴.

Victims of violent crime, whose home address was in Sunderland followed a similar proportional split to where the crime was committed in Sunderland, although domestic violence was slightly higher at 17.6%.

Men are more likely to be victims of violent crime on the street perpetrated by strangers. During 2008/09, 91% of male victims compared to 68% of female victims were attacked by strangers.

Women are more likely to be victims in the home perpetrated by someone known to them. During 2008/09, 29% of female violent crime victims were subjected to domestic violence.

4. Property-Related Crime in Sunderland

During 2008/09 there were 19,481 items of stolen property recorded by Northumbria Police in Sunderland (where the crime was committed in Sunderland). 3,063 (16%) of these items were recovered. The total value of property stolen (including that recovered) was £7,323,220. The total value of property recovered was £1,880,481.

In Sunderland during 2008/09:

- The most common item stolen was cash, accounting for 7% of all types of property stolen. The total amount of cash stolen was approximately £982,914, 13% of the total value of all property stolen.
- Automobile thefts accounted for 4% of all types of property stolen, however, in monetary terms stolen automobiles accounted for over one third (34%) of the total value of all property stolen, the highest for any type of property.
- The most expensive item stolen was a 'Block Cutter' for business victims, whilst for person victims the most expensive item was an automobile.

5. 'Business' Victims in Sunderland

In 2008/09 there were 7,027 business victims of crimes committed in Sunderland. One third (33%) of these crimes were against Northumbria Police (this includes crimes against The Crown / Regina).

- The majority (99%) of Violent Crimes against businesses were against the Police.
- The 56 Burglary Dwelling business victims were primarily property management companies, housing associations, or Arms Length Management Organisation (ALMO) responsible for managing former council homes.

In 2008/09 there were 4,377 business victims of crime in Sunderland, where the business 'home' address was given as being in Sunderland. The crime will have been committed within Tyne & Wear, although not necessarily within Sunderland. 6. Location Profile of Victims in Sunderland

In 2008/09 there were 16,031 victims, where the crime was committed in Sunderland. 90% of these victims also lived within Sunderland.

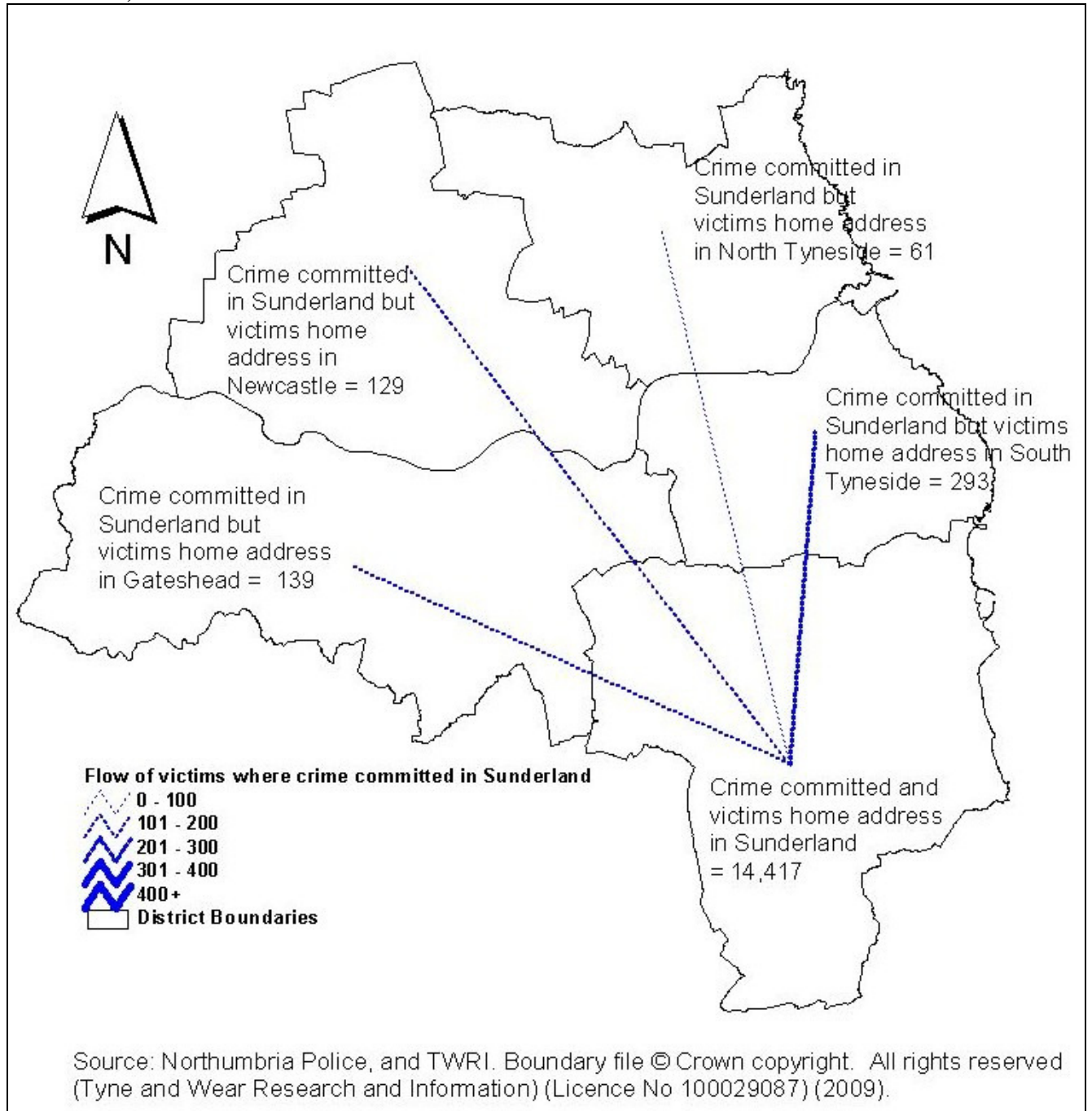
4% of victims of crimes in Sunderland came from one of the other four Tyne & Wear Districts, whilst 6% came from outside of Tyne & Wear. Of those victims living outside of Tyne & Wear 47% from County Durham, 20% were from Northumberland and 5% from the Tees Valley area, whilst the remaining 27% were from areas outside of the North East.

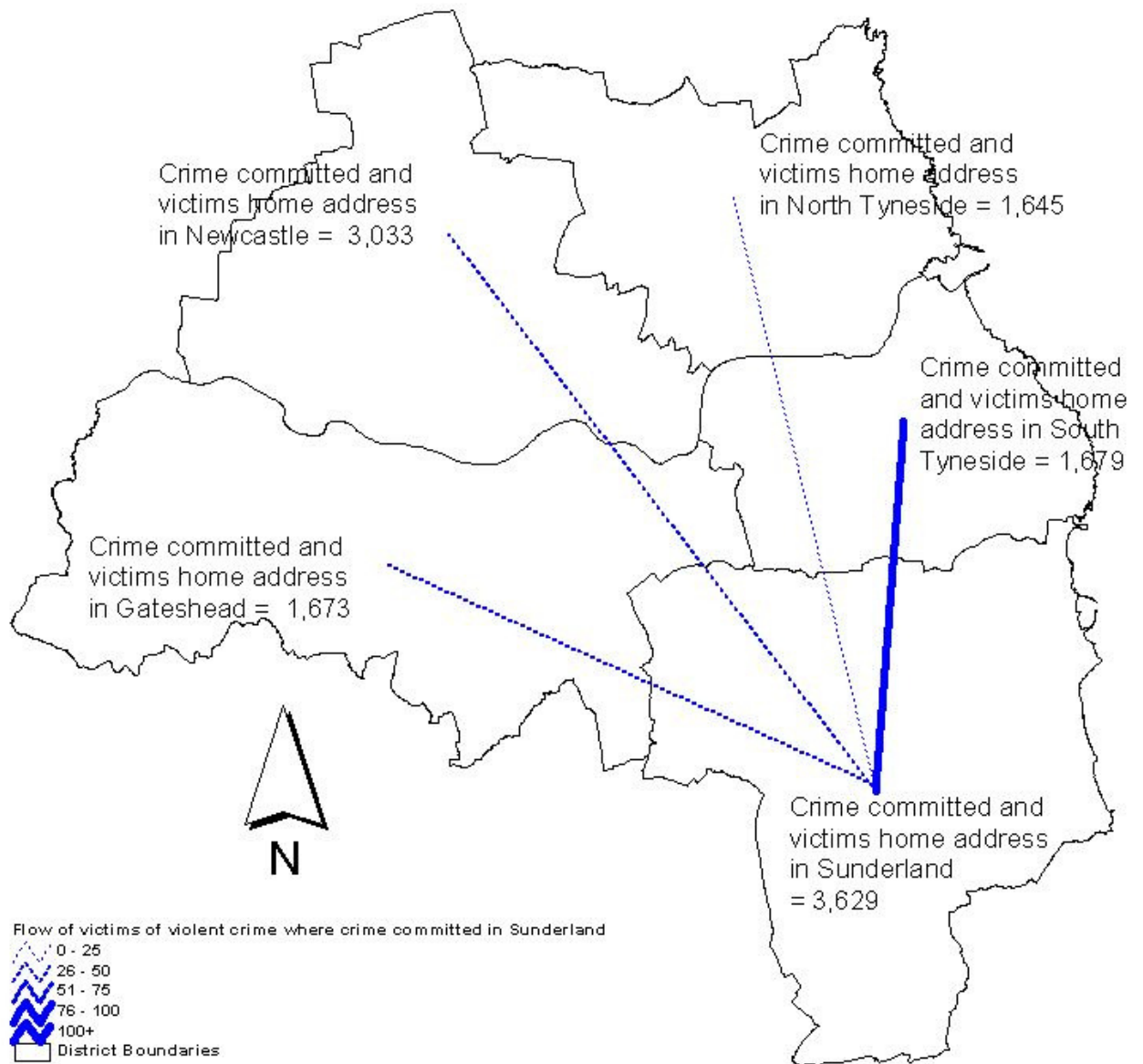

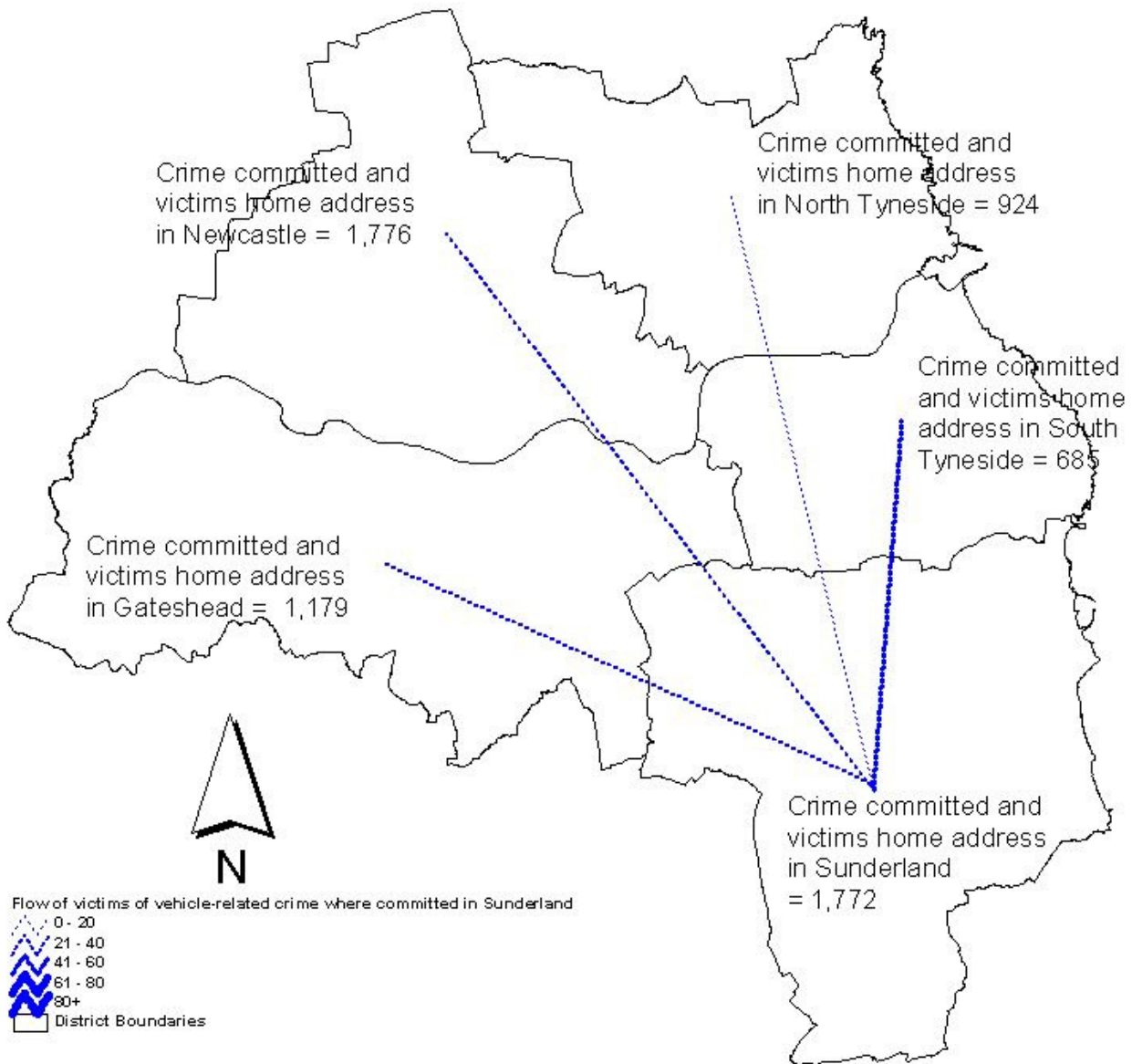

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Map 3: The Location of Vehicle-related Victims Home Addresses in Relation to Where the Crime was Committed, Sunderland, 2008/09



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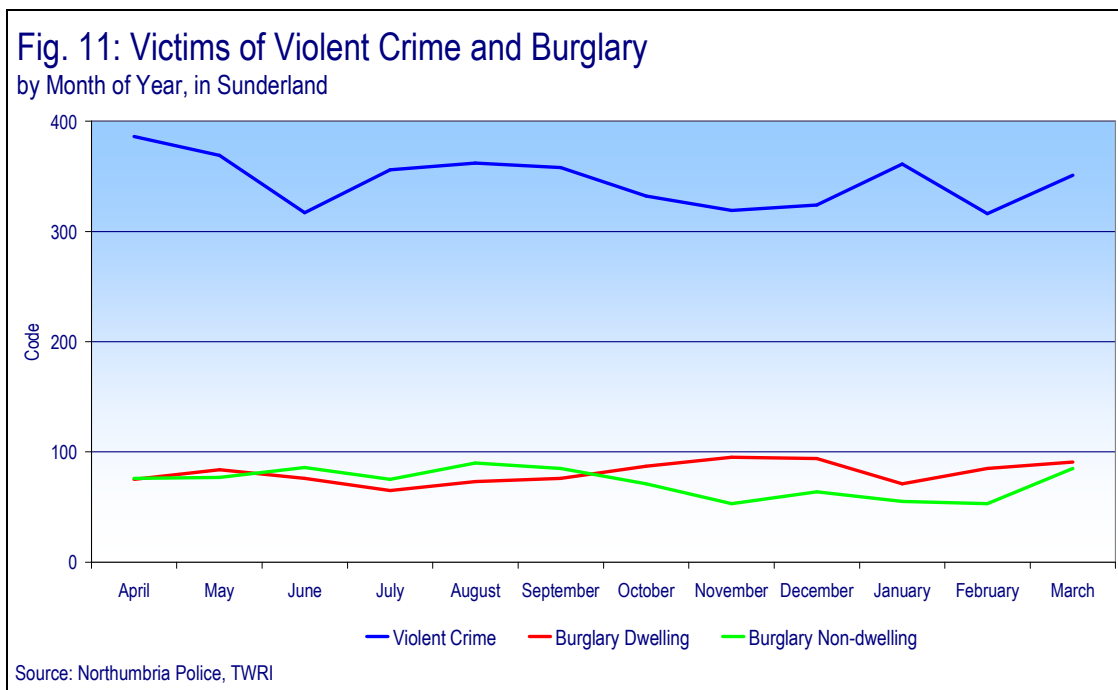
7. Temporal Profile of Victims in Sunderland

Crime trends can be influenced by a range of factors that fluctuate according to time of the week or time of the year. Influencing factors include increased alcohol consumption in town centres at the weekend, influx of visitors/tourism, rain and low temperatures and seasonal holidays.

Recording the time at which some types of high volume crime take place can be problematic. For example, when vehicle crime takes place overnight, or when a burglary takes place while the occupier is on holiday. There will be a range, covering the earliest and latest times possible for the offence to have occurred. For the purposes of this report the earliest time and date for the offence to have occurred has been used.

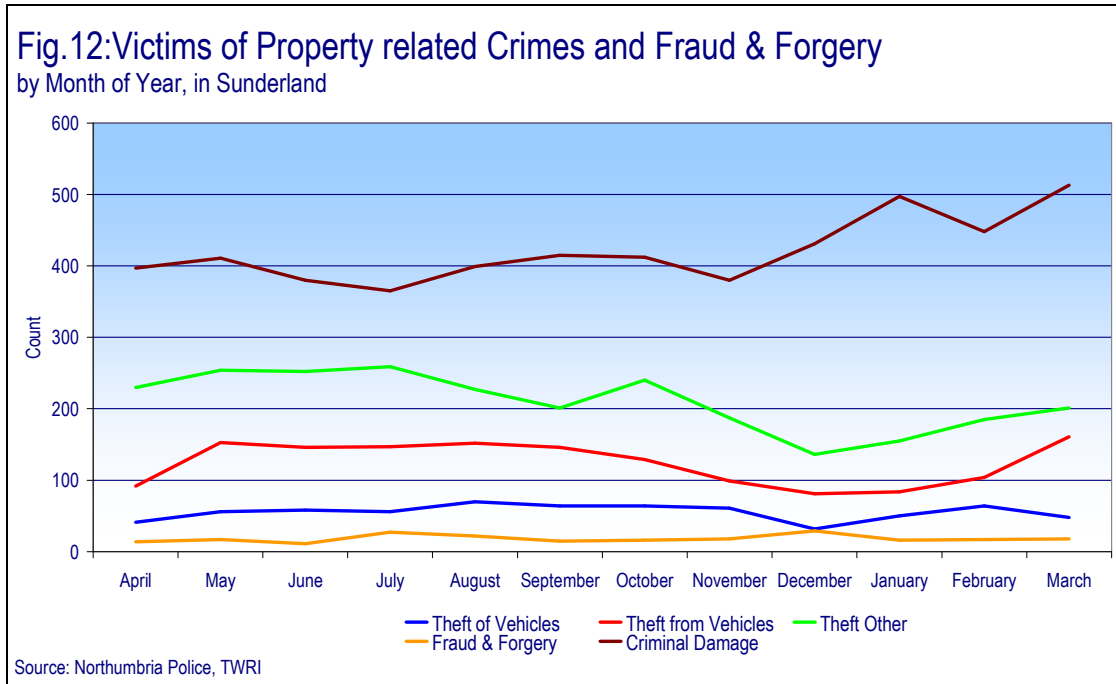
During 2008/09 in Sunderland:

- There were on average 346 victims of Violent Crime per month. July to September quarter saw the most victims of this type of crime. April had the highest number of violent crime victims and February the lowest.
- There were on average 81 victims of Burglary Dwelling per month. October to December quarter had the most victims of Burglary Dwellings. November had the highest number of Burglary Dwellings victims and July the lowest number.
- There were on average 73 victims of Burglary Non-dwellings per month. July to September quarter had the most Burglary Non-dwellings victims. August had the highest number of Burglary Non-dwelling victims and November and February the lowest number.



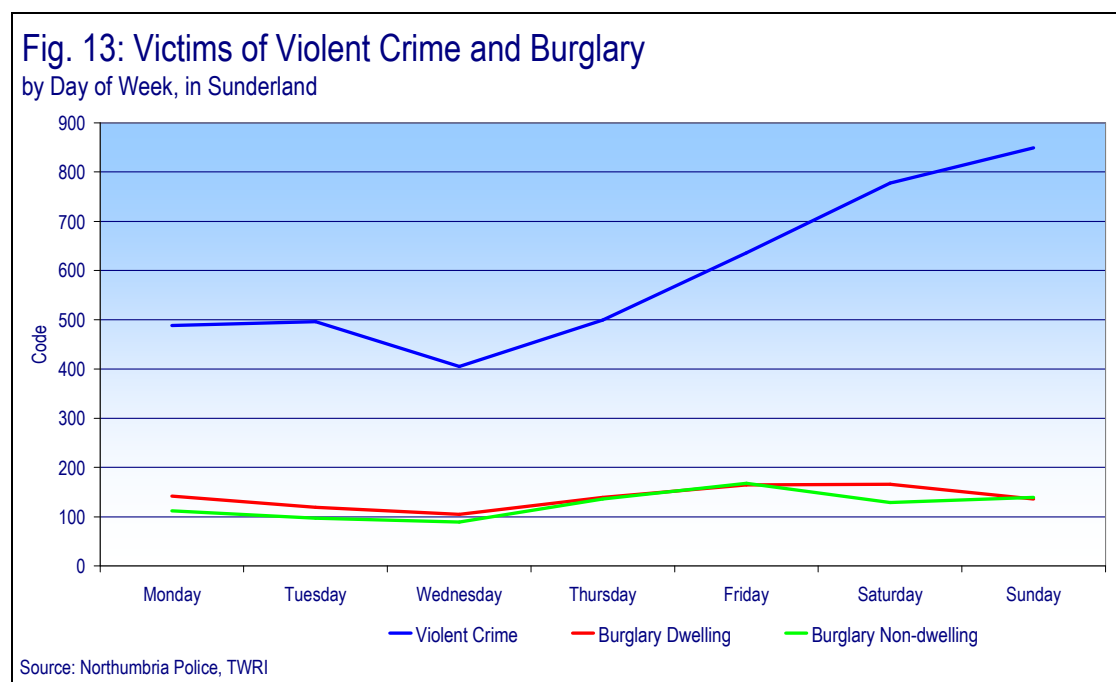
During 2008/09 in Sunderland:

- There were on average 55 victims of Theft of Vehicle per month. The summer quarter of July to September had the most victims of Theft of Vehicles. August had the highest number of Theft of Vehicle victims and December the lowest.
- On average there were 125 victims of Theft from Vehicle per month. As for Theft of Vehicles, the summer quarter of July to September had the most Theft from Vehicles. March had the highest number of Theft from Vehicles victims and December the lowest.
- There were on average 211 Theft Other victims per month. April to June quarter had the most Theft Other victims. July had the highest number of Theft Other victims and December the lowest.
- There were on average 18 Fraud & Forgery victims per month. July to September quarter had the most Fraud & Forgery victims recorded. December had the highest number of Fraud & Forgery victims whilst June had the lowest number.
- There were on average 421 victims of Criminal Damage per month. The winter quarter of January to March had the most victims. The number of Criminal Damage victims was highest in March and the lowest in July.



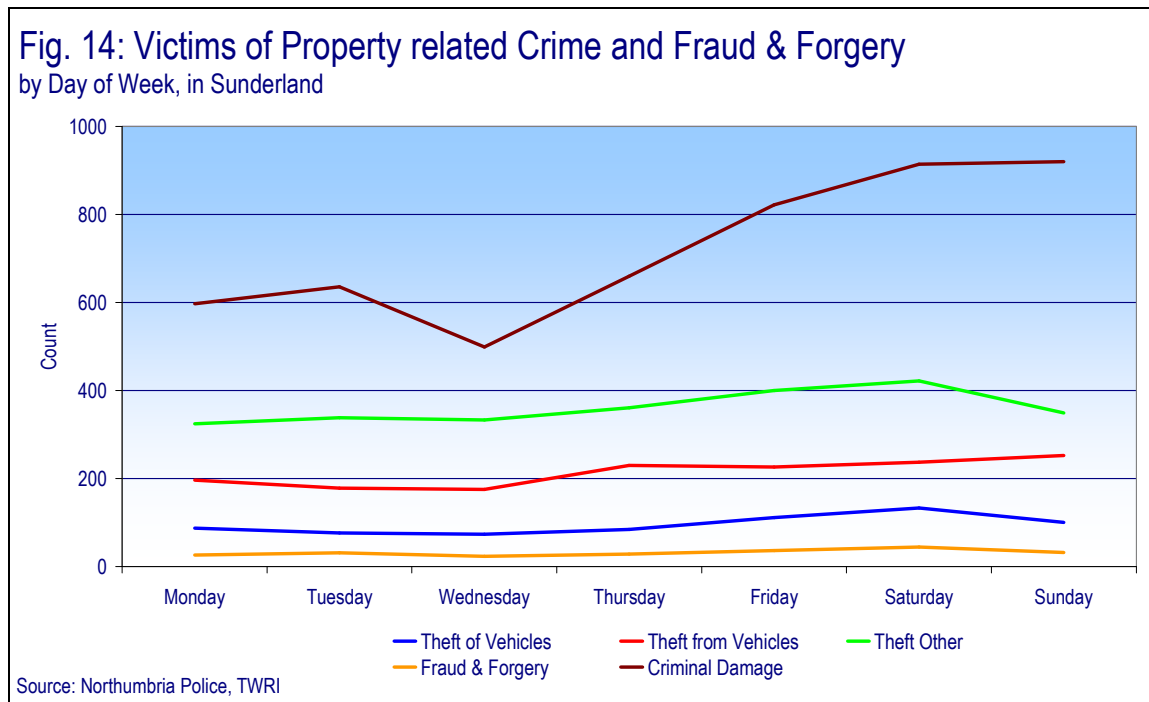
During 2008/09 in Sunderland:

- There were on average 593 victims of Violent Crime per day of the week. Saturdays and Sundays saw the highest numbers of victims of Violent Crime. This could be due to the increased levels of alcohol-related crimes associated with weekend drinking. The least number of Violent Crime victims were recorded on Wednesdays (405).
- There were on average 139 victims of Burglary Dwelling and 124 of Burglary Non-dwelling per day of the week. Fridays and Saturdays saw the highest numbers of victims of Burglary (Dwelling). Friday and Sunday saw the highest number of victims of Burglary Non dwellings. The lowest numbers of victims of Burglaries (Dwelling and Non-dwelling) were on Wednesdays.



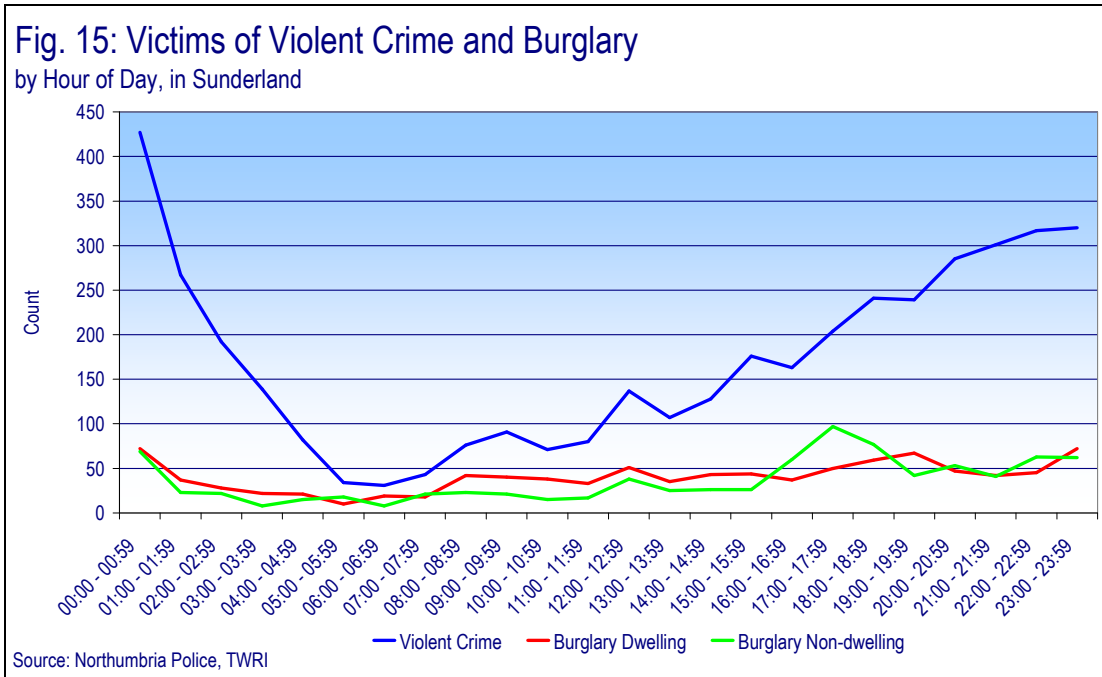
During 2008/09 in Sunderland:

- The likelihood of being a victim of Theft of a Vehicle was greater on Fridays to Sundays than the other weekdays. There were on average 95 victims of Theft of Vehicles and 213 Theft from Vehicles per day of the week.
- On average there were 361 victims of Theft Other per day of the week. Fridays and Saturdays saw the highest numbers. The least number of Theft Other victims were on Mondays.
- There were on average 31 victims of Fraud & Forgery per day of the week.
- There were on average 721 victims of Criminal Damage per day of the week. Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays saw the highest numbers of victims of Criminal Damage, averaging 885 per day. The least number of Criminal Damage victims were on a Wednesday (499).



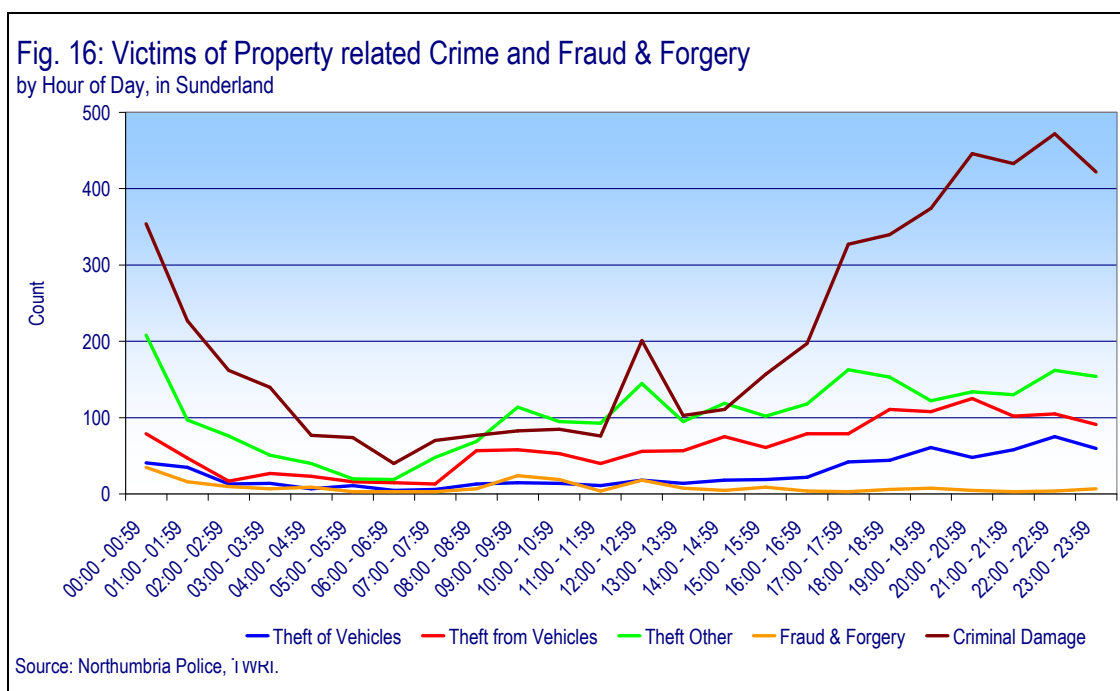
During 2008/09 in Sunderland:

- There was a steady increase in the number of victims of violent crime from early morning (6-7am) to a peak between 12am and 1am. The number of victims between 9pm and 1am accounted for one third of all violent crime victims. Between 1am and 6am the number of victims fell sharply.
- There were smaller peaks in the number of violent crime victims between 9-10am, 12-1pm and 3-4pm. Victims aged between 10 and 17 accounted for approximately 35% of all violent crime victims during the 12-1pm and 3-4pm peaks, coinciding with school lunch breaks and school children going home from school.
- Those victims of Violent Crime aged 18-24 years were more likely to be a victim between 9pm-4am, than any other age group.
- The number of victims of Burglary Dwelling was fairly evenly split across the day. There were small peaks in the number of victims of Burglary Dwelling between 12- 1pm and 7-8pm.
- For those retired victims the peak time for Burglary Dwelling crimes was between 6-7pm and 11pm-12am. For those in employment peaks occurred between 11pm and 1am.
- The number of victims of Burglary Non-dwelling was fairly evenly split across the day, with a peak between 5-6pm. This was followed by a relatively large dip between 7-8pm.



During 2008/09 in Sunderland:

- There was a steady increase in the number of victims of Vehicle Crime from early morning (6-7am) to a peak between 10-11pm for Theft of Vehicles and 8-9pm for Theft from Vehicles. Those in employment experienced a peak in the number of Theft from Vehicles between 6-8pm.
- The number of victims of Theft Other crimes increased from early morning (6-7am) to peak between midnight and 1am. There were smaller peaks between 12-1pm and 5-6pm. These peaks coincide with traditional lunchtime hour and workers travelling home. The peak time period for victims of Theft Other aged 18-24 was between 10pm-3am.
- The number of victims of Fraud & Forgery was consistently spread across the day.
- The number of victims of Criminal Damage increased from early morning (6-7am) to peak between 12-1pm, before continuing to rise to peak again between 8-9pm and then again between 10-11pm.
