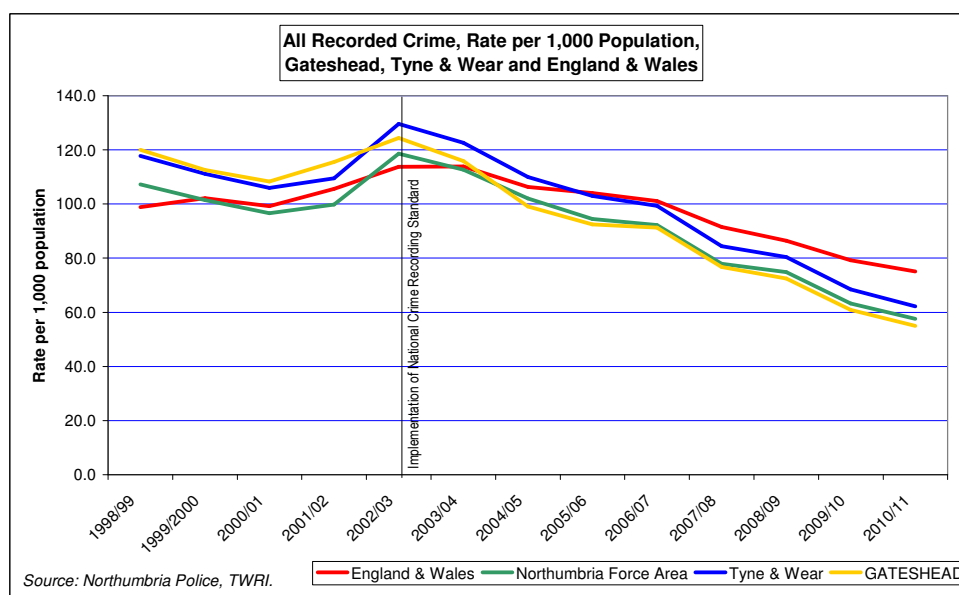


This bulletin provides a summary of police recorded crime¹ in Gateshead from Q1 2010 to Q1 2011.

Police recorded crime figures for 2010/11 continue to show a downward trend, having fallen by 4.3% since the previous year in England & Wales.

Recorded Crime – Time Series

- In 2010/11 there were 10,543 crimes recorded in Gateshead. This was 1,070 (-9.2%) less than the previous year.
- Since 2002/03 (adoption of the NCRS²) the rate of total crime in Gateshead has fallen by 69.3 per 1,000 population to 55.0. In England & Wales a fall was also experienced, down by 38.5 per 1,000 population to 75.1.
- The total number of recorded crimes in Gateshead fell from 23,736 to 10,543 between 2002/03 and 2010/11 and in England & Wales from 5,974,960 to 4,150,097 over the same period.



Crimes by Type, Quarter April – June 2011

- The total number of recorded crimes in Gateshead in Q1 (April – June) 2011 was 2,361, 20.2% lower than in Q1 2009 and 17.2% lower than in Q1 2010.
- Between Q1 2009 and Q1 2011 the rate per 1,000 population (households Burglary-Dwelling) fell in ten crime types, stayed the same in one crime type, but rose in one, Drug Offences.

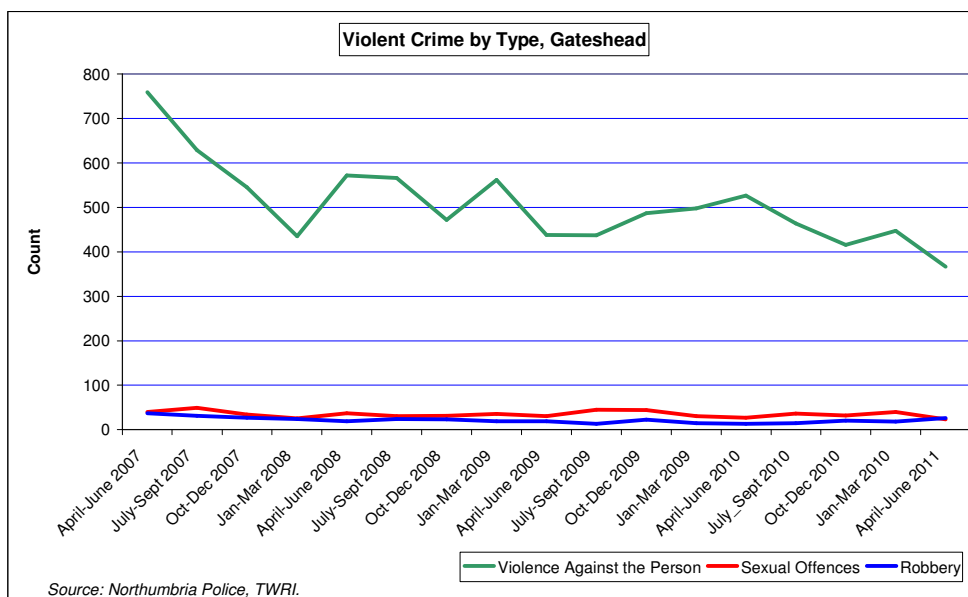

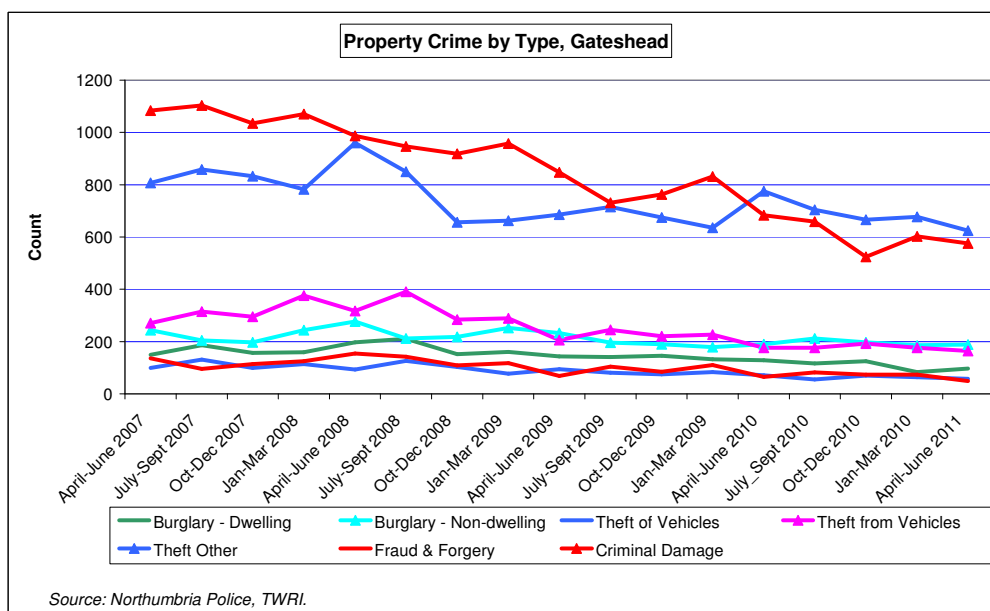
**Violent Crime
Q1 2010 – Q1 2011**

- Violent crime comprises Violence Against the Person (VAP), Sexual Offences and Robbery. VAP covers the whole spectrum of assaults from pushing and shoving, with no physical harm, to murder.
- Comparing Q1 2010 with Q1 2011, VAP fell by 160 (-30.4%), Sexual Offences fell by 4 (-14.8%), whilst Robbery rose by 13 (+100%).



**Property Crime
Q1 2010 – Q1 2011**

- Property crime covers the various ways that individuals, households or corporate bodies have their property damaged or are deprived of it by illegal means (or where there is intent to do so).
- Comparing Q1 2010 with Q1 2011, the largest fall in property crime types was for Theft Other, the largest percentage fall was for Fraud & Forgery.

¹ Figures quoted within this bulletin may not exactly match figures from other sources such as iQuanta. This is due to data extraction occurring at different times and also the impact of 'no-crimes' and 'statistically continuous' crimes.

² The National Crime Recording Standard (NCRS) was adopted by all police forces in England & Wales in April 2002 in an effort to improve the consistency of police recording and to better reflect the demands made on the police by victims of crime.
